Some characteristics of psoriatic arthritis – for example symmetric arthritis involving the small joints of the hands – can occur in both conditions. So if a patient with skin psoriasis had these symptoms, the doctor would likely diagnose psoriatic arthritis, rather than psoriasis plus rheumatoid arthritis.
