Numerous publications have indicated the need for improved integrated pediatric care within the prehospital setting. 4,5,25,26,36 EMS systems can adopt policies, practices, and procedures that guide provider prehospital pediatric emergency care. Pediatric-specific components that will aid in improving care include pediatric-specific education, equipment, QI, data collection and management, and research.

BACKGROUND The concept of EMS encompasses many areas of emergency care, including the triage, evaluation, management, and transport of patients from the scene of an injury or illness to their arrival at an emergency care facility (the out-of-hospital or prehospital care), as well as the management within the emergency department.

Prehospital emergency aid was most frequently administered to children by emergency medical services personnel (42.7%) and a primary health care physician (28.1%). Injuries of head (42.1%), neck (1.1%), chest (1.7%), abdomen (2.5%), upper (32.2%), and lower (19.9%) limbs as well as burns (5.3%) were diagnosed in pediatric patients.
