All relative clauses describe a noun, and they begin with one of these relative pronouns or relative adverbs.. Relative Pronouns. who (to describe people – subject) The woman who works in the bank is my neighbor.; whom (to describe people – object) My cousins, one of whom is a doctor, live in England.
